- First.- 500€
- Second.- 400€

9.- Race numbers are individual and non-transferable. Numbers must be worn on the front of athlete's shirts and visible at all times during the event, without folds or creases. Failure to observe this rule can result in disqualification.

Entry will be refused to anyone who is not registered or wearing an official race number, in order to respect the rights of other participants. Only authorised vehicles will be allowed to circulate for runner's safety.

The Organisation and its judges reserve the authority to disqualify any participant who breaches the event regulations, whose race number is not visible, who obstructs or interferes with another participant, who does not comply with the established race route, who falsifies, alters or withholds any information in relation to his/her identify or affiliation, or fails to provide the required documentation, or who fails to comply with any other aspect of RFEA or IAAF regulations

Disqualified participants will lose their right to trophies or prize money.

10.- Distance marker points will be visible at every kilometre throughout the race course. There will be an Aid Station situated at 5 kilometre intervals, in line with I.A.A.F guidelines, with extra refreshment posts in between.

11.- First Aid and Emergency Services will be in place under the coordination of the Organisation, in accordance with the Event's Health and Safety Plan.

All participants must write their name, emergency telephone contact number and details of any health problems or medication on the reverse of the race number, which must be worn on the front of shirts during the race. Participants should also inform the race organisers of any special medical conditions and of their blood group.
